## The Fault In Our Stars

Let's start with the most recent, the first movie, most well-known, and which probably caused increased tissue sales. It's the story of Hazel Grace, a teen doing all the normal teen things, but while battling cancer. It's a heartbreaking story that'll simultaneously have you in fits of giggles. ### Paper Towns

If you only saw the movie, you need to read Paper Towns. Q and Margo Roth Spiegelman's adventures in Sea World are every person's dream (but with some of those revenge pranks maybe it's best left a dream). Paper Towns is the story of Q's crush on his popular neighbor, and her desire to escape from her life that's not as perfect as it seems.

Colin Singleton was a child prodigy who feared he wouldn't be a genius and had dated 19 girls named Katherine. All with the same spelling. After the breakup with number 19, his best friend convinced him to go on a summer road trip. They end up working in a small town for a woman whose factory manufactures tampon strings. An Abundance of Katherines is the young adult coming of age, boy meets girl, but as with all of John Green's books, the characters are realistic and relatable and draw you in, regardless of your age.
